Brent LeggsGuest Speaker

Brent Leggs is the executive director of the <u>African American</u>
<u>Cultural Heritage Action Fund</u> and senior vice president of the

National Trust. Envisioned as a social movement for justice, equity, and reconciliation, the Action Fund is promoting the role of cultural preservation in telling the nation's full history, while also empowering activists, entrepreneurs, artists, and civic leaders to advocate on behalf of African American historic places.

A Harvard University Loeb Fellow and author of *Preserving African American Historic Places*, which is considered the "seminal publication on preserving African American historic sites" by the Smithsonian Institution, Brent is a national leader in the U.S. preservation movement and the 2018 recipient of the Robert G. Stanton National Preservation Award. His passion for elevating the significance of black culture in American history is visible through his work, which elevates the remarkable stories and places that evoke centuries of black activism, achievement, and community.

Over the past decade, he has developed the Northeast African American Historic Places Outreach Program, and its theme, the *Business of Preservation*, to build a regional movement of preservation leaders saving important landmarks in African American history. As the project manager for several National Treasure campaigns across the country, he led efforts to create the <u>Birmingham Civil Rights National Monument</u> in Alabama, which President Barack Obama designated in January 2017. Other campaign successes include the perpetual protection of cultural monuments like <u>Villa Lewaro</u>, the estate of Madam C. J. Walker in Irvington, New York; <u>Joe Frazier's Gym</u> in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; <u>Hinchliffe Stadium</u> in Paterson, New Jersey; <u>A. G. Gaston Motel</u> in Birmingham; <u>Nina Simone's birthplace</u> in Tryon, North Carolina; <u>John and Alice Coltrane's home</u> in Huntington, New York; and more.

Brent has taught at Harvard University, Boston Architectural College and the University of Maryland. He is a Senior Advisor and Adjunct Associate Professor at the University of Pennsylvania's Center for the Preservation of Civil Rights Sites (CPCRS) and is an Adjunct Professor at Columbia University's graduate program in Historic Preservation.

2024 Laity Award Recipient

Sandy Adams



As a proud Washingtonian with a BFA in Photojournalism from the Rochester Institute of Technology, I have a deep passion for capturing the beauty of the world through my lens. After a brief hiatus from photography, I rediscovered my love for the craft and sharpened my skills to bring my unique vision to life.

Although I have always admired the art of drawing, it's not a talent that came naturally to me. Instead, I rely on my camera as a means of artistic expression, capturing the world from my perspective with clarity and emotion.

My pause from photography came during a 30-year career in public service, beginning in New York, where I made history as the first Black and the first Black female EMT, as well as the first Black and first Black female marine firefighter. I also served as a police officer and concluded my public service as a special agent with the District of Columbia's Office of Inspector General. Throughout my career, I was honored to be the first DCOIG recipient of the prestigious U.S. Department of Justice, United States Attorney's Office Award. Other recognitions include the Green Cross for Safety from the City of Rochester and two Excellent Police Service Awards.

Alongside my public service career, I own and operate Outdoorvizions Photography, where I specialize in outdoor decorative art and event photography. My work is an escape from the demands of everyday life, capturing a wide range of scenes, from urban man-made environments to breathtaking natural landscapes. My personal photojournalism projects focus on candid, authentic moments, reflecting both my artistic vision and commitment to truth.

In addition to running my own business, I have worked briefly with Lifetouch Church Division and have had the privilege of assisting esteemed Black photographers such as Sharon Farmer, Leigh Mosley, and George Tolbert. My photography career has earned me honors including 2nd Place Photographer of the Year and Merit of Excellence at the 2019 14th Annual Black and White Spider Awards, and Category Winner, Open Theme, at the 2024 24th Julia Margaret Cameron Award. I am also the author of *Icebergs and Glaciers: Vanishing Beauties*, with work featured in numerous publications and exhibitions, including the 2024 50th Anniversary of Artomatic. My photographs are also part of several private collections.

As an active member of The Exposure Group - An African American Photographers Association, I currently serve as secretary, although I suspect they may be encouraging me toward the role of vice president.

Beyond my professional pursuits, I remain deeply involved in my church community, from my early days as an acolyte and youth choir member to more recent roles such as church photographer, Chair of Church Council, Assistant Lay Leader, and Audio/Video Technician. Some might even say I'm the unofficial assistant to the Trustee Board.

Thought for the Month: Change your church culture. Create an outwardly focused environment where hospitality and invitation happen Sunday and every day of the week. This book offers five steps to help congregations go public with their faith—from service projects to sharing the faith with persons who want to know more about Christ and the church. This book offers tactics to increase individual and church competency with relational evangelism with friends, neighbors, and even strangers. Learn how to start up a conversation, follow up with contacts, and navigate unfamiliar settings. Learn what works and what doesn't.

The church provides parking passes (half sheet paper passes) to use as you exit the garage. You must give the parking attendant your printed ticket and the parking pass.




October - Pastor Appreciation Month




