Thought for the Month: Change your church culture. Create an outwardly focused environment where hospitality and invitation happen Sunday and every day of the week. This book offers five steps to help congregations go public with their faith—from service projects to sharing the faith with persons who want to know more about Christ and the church. This book offers tactics to increase individual and church competency with relational evangelism with friends, neighbors, and even strangers. Grace and Peace Faithful Asburyans,



Asbury United Methodist Church Health Ministry Newsletter, October 2024 The vaccines you need this fall and winter 2024 – 2025 By Drs. Clive and Ealena Callender

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends updated vaccines to protect against common respiratory diseases.

COVID-19: The updated COVID vaccine is recommended for everyone over 6 months of age, especially adults over age 65. The COVID virus continues to change so it is important to get updated vaccines that protect against new variants. The vaccines help prevent hospitalizations and save thousands of lives. Updated vaccines will be available from Moderna, Novavax and Pfizer this fall and winter. In 2023, more than 900,000 people were hospitalized due to COVID-19 and more than 75,000 people died from COVID-19.

FLU: The updated flu vaccine will protect against three different variants of influenza including H1N1, H3N2 and B/Victoria lineage viruses. Due to their waning immune systems, adults ages 65 and over should get a high-dose vaccine. During the 2023-2024 flu season, about 45,000 people died from influenza.


RSV: The vaccine for respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is recommended for adults aged 60 and over; especially those with chronic health conditions like cardio-pulmonary diseases and diabetes, as well as kidney, liver and blood disorders.

These three vaccines should be administered in late September or October to make sure protection lasts throughout the entire flu season.

Other recommended vaccinations protect against shingles and pneumococcal disease. Shingrix, the two-dose vaccination for shingles, helps prevent a painful condition more common in adults over age 50. Shingles is related to the virus that causes chicken pox. The condition is characterized by skin lesions and intense nerve pain. The latest pneumonia vaccines, called pneumococcal conjugate vaccines or PCVs, have been updated to provide longer-lasting immunity. They are recommended for all adults 65 and older and should be given every five years. The specific vaccine you receive will depend on whether you have been previously vaccinated, when you were vaccinated and with which version. Please consult your primary care physician to ensure you get the correct type of pneumonia vaccine and the correct number of doses.

The months between November and April are associated with thousands of hospitalizations and deaths from respiratory infections. Updated vaccinations are designed to decrease that number in adults over 65 years of age. Please ensure that you are vaccinated before November. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!


