

Scripture of the Month: Book of James

Thought for the Month: Change your church culture. Create an outwardly focused environment where hospitality and invitation happen Sunday and every day of the week. This book offers five steps to help congregations go public with their faith—from service projects to sharing the faith with persons who want to know more about Christ and the church. This book offers tactics to increase individual and church competency with relational evangelism with friends, neighbors, and even strangers. Learn how to start up a conversation, follow up with contacts, and navigate unfamiliar settings. Learn what works and what doesn't.

We may think that just because we invite someone on our church property, they'll come back. Often we don't reach out to help people cross the faith line, because we're uncomfortable with "evangelism" or just plain scared. Gain the confidence to share the good news boldly. After all, we know the name of the One who loves us all and who holds all power over heaven and earth.



Asbury United Methodist Church Health Ministry Newsletter November 2024 By Drs. Ealena and Clive Callender End of Life Planning: A Must for All

Although death is a universal experience, most people are uncomfortable discussing important end-of-life plans. An AARP End-of-Life Survey done this year found that seven out of ten people avoid discussing this topic. While thinking of a loved one's death may be emotionally difficult, discussions about end-of-life wishes are among the most critical conversations of your life. Sharing your wishes with your family gives them a valuable gift that can help ease some of the stress of a challenging time.

The following items should be included in your End-of-Life Plans:

- 1. **Advanced Directives** are a set of instructions that can clearly identify your wishes for medical care in serious medical situations and help relieve the burden on your family. This document may apply to any severe medical conditions, such as stroke or coma, that leave you unable to communicate your wishes. Once you have completed this document, it is essential to review your desires annually.
- 2. A **Living Will** is a type of advanced directive that identifies your wishes regarding life-sustaining medical treatments if you are terminally ill and unable to communicate your desires. The living will outlines which medical treatments you want or do not want and reflects your wishes about how your last days may be spent. The living will applies if one is permanently unconscious or at the end of a terminal illness. In this document, you will address questions including:
 - A. Do you want to be resuscitated?
 - B. Do you want a feeding tube?
 - C. Do you want to be hospitalized, or would you prefer to die at home?
 - D. Do you want artificial breathing tubes used to keep you alive?
- 3. A **Living Trust** expresses precisely what you want done with your assets, finances and other possessions both while you are living and after you die. Itemizing your assets is the first step. Legal help is optional in Maryland, but states may differ. Your signature and the signatures of two witnesses not named in the will and witness your free will consent are obligatory. The simpler you make it the better.
- 4. Power of Attorney designates a person you want to make decisions for you when you can not make decisions for yourself. This person should be chosen when you are healthy and in your right mind. Doing so in advance is beneficial to your loved ones. AARP recommends that everyone over 18 should have this document in place.
- 5. Your **Last Will and Testament** details the distribution of assets and management of your affairs. It must be signed by you and witnessed by two individuals who are not included in the will.
- 6. Making Funeral and Burial Plans will greatly help family members as well. These can range from basic ideas to a detailed plan. For example, some will designate favorite hymns, scriptures or poems they want included in their services.
- 7. Organ and Tissue Donation Designation is a desirable next step. One person's organs can save eight lives and enhance the lives of 75 individuals. Once you say yes to organ and tissue donation, it is essential to inform your family and include your decision in your end-of-life documents.
- 8. Some individuals will prepare an **Obituary and Death Notice**, relieving stress for family members.
- 9. Once you are ready, organize all of your important documents and records in one location and let your family members know where to find them. Making your end-of-life plans well ahead of time will make things easier for your family when the time comes.


