

Monday—Friday

Asburyans and guests, on church business, should park in the parking garage and bring the printed parking ticket with them to be validated in the church office. Park on levels P2 or P3 and take the elevator to the "G" level to exit the building (to the left toward 11th Street). Drivers will scan the front of the ticket (invoice) and then scan the back (the payment). Push the call button if you have any issues and the LAZ Garage Staff will assist you.

Saturday & Sunday

Parking is available on Saturday and Sunday until 4 pm (unless otherwise noted). Park on levels P2 or P3 and take the elevator to the "G" level to exit the building (to the left toward 11th Street). The church provides parking passes (half sheet paper passes) to use as you exit the garage. You must give the parking attendant your printed ticket and the parking pass.







THE STEWARDSHIP OF GIVING

Financial Update: 2024 Year-to-Date Giving Summary

Grace and Peace Faithful Asburyans,

Thank you for your past and ongoing stewardship! Your gifts support Asbury's operations and the impactful ministries that serve our community. The 2024 monthly budget **giving target is \$94,229** (see the solid line in the graph below). **Through November**, we have met this target in April, July, and September (December 31, 2023 was a Sunday, resulting in funds deposited in January). 2024's lower giving levels has negatively impacted our ability to fully fund our ministries. We ask you to prayerfully consider increasing your December gifts, to enable ending 2024 in a healthy financial position.

- 2 Corinthians 9: 6-8: The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work.



Dear Asbury Church Family,

By the grace of God we have had another amazing year. These are a few highlights:

- We were blessed to offer a hybrid worship experience every Sunday and on special days.
- On Easter Sunday we reached over 1,200 people through our in-person services and livestreaming on YouTube and Facebook.
- We supported our community through the Nehemiah Fund, Food Pantry, Sunday Morning Outreach, and Dinner Church, partnering with organizations that include Downtown DCBID, Impact Fellowship Church, SHARE Network, Mulholland Foundation, and Community Partnership for the Prevention of Homelessness for a broader outreach.
- We supported the following organizations that serve young people: Project Transformation, TraRon Center, Homeless Children's Playtime Project, and Thomson Elementary School.
- Our Sunday school has resumed classes in-person for children, youth, and adults.
- We continue to connect online with bible studies, small groups, workshops, panel discussions, fellowship opportunities, and administrative meetings.
- Our Music Ministry continues to inspire us with the Asbury Ensemble and gifted vocalists and instrumentalists from the Washington Metropolitan area.
- We have remained current and are committed to paying 100% apportionments in connectional responsibility to support Baltimore-Washington Conference and world missions.

Accomplishing these things has not been without financial challenges. It has required that we reduce staff and significantly tighten our ministry budget. At the same time, we are continuing to work hard at meeting the challenges of major repairs to our aging building. The repairs include the bell tower, the educational building roof, the elevator, plumbing, HVAC, and flooring. These necessary repairs are beyond our planned operating budget.

We invite you to help us finish the year strong with an end-of-year financial gift to Asbury. **As you review your giving and the many ways God has blessed you in 2024, prayerfully consider catching up on your pledge. 
