

## Asbury United Methodist Church Health Ministry Newsletter February 2025 By Drs. Ealena Callender and Clive Callender The New Wonder Drug of the 21st Century: GLP-1 Agonists

GLP-1 Agonists are a relatively new class of drug initially introduced in 2005 to treat Type II Diabetes. The drugs mimic hormones produced by the small intestine called glucagon-like peptides. They are approved by the FDA to help manage blood sugar in Type 2 diabetics. Since their initial approval, these drugs have been found to have many additional benefits and applications. Most notably, the class has become well-known and widely used to aid in weight loss for those with obesity. GLP-1 medications are most often given as a weekly injection, although a few require daily dosing. One is given as a daily pill.

#### How do the medications work?

- Trigger the production of insulin. Patients with diabetes may not produce enough insulin, leading to high blood sugar.
- Slow the release of the hormone glucagon, which helps raise blood sugar levels.
- Delay digestion so glucose from food is released into the bloodstream more slowly.
- Improve how the brain processes the feeling of fullness after a meal.

Additionally, this class of medication has powerful anti-inflammatory effects that make it useful for a wide range of illnesses. Most diseases that afflict humans are caused by inflammatory conditions, so these drugs have the potential to help treat many chronic diseases. However, since they have not been in use for very long, we do not know much about their long-term effects.

Research on GLP-1 medications has found these drugs may have the following benefits:

- Reduce hardening of the arteries
- Lower blood pressure
- Treat some neurodegenerative diseases
   (Ataxia, memory disorders, Parkinsons disease)
- Control diabetic neuropathy
- Slow the progression of chronic kidney disease
- Improve symptoms of osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis
- Reverse some types liver diseases that were formerly considered irreversible

Treat diabetic kidney disease


Reduce the risk of Alzheimer's disease

- Treat depression
- Combat drug addiction
- Decrease asthma attacks

Medication cost and availability have a major impact on access to GLP-1 drugs. Costs may be covered by some insurance plans, including Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Medicare,

Medicaid and Cigna. If not covered by insurance, the drugs may cost over \$1,000 a month. Also, because the drugs are so widely used, medication shortages have made access even more complicated.

While these "wonder drugs" are a great resource, they do not replace the need for regular exercise, meditation, eating a nutritious diet, taking prescribed medications and following your doctor's recommendations to maintain overall health.



#### THE NEHEMIAH FUND


